Examining veterinarian sends all results to NRR. Positive findings must be documented. A copy is sent to breeder when registering litters.

General evaluation.

Cats with cysts: If cysts are found during this examination, the cat should be neutered/spayed and not used for breeding purposes. The cat's health should be monitored regularly in order to detect any symptoms of PKD (and treatment can start).

Cats without cysts: If cysts are not found during this examination, and the cat is more than 10 months old, there is a high probability that the cat does not have PKD. However, a small number of cats found negative at the first examination, may have small cysts that are not noticeable at that time. It is therefore recommended that such cats are reexamined by ultrasound not earlier than 6 months after the first examination.
